FAIR PRE-ENTRY DEADLINE...

July 2, 2018 by 4:00 pm at the Extension Office

This includes livestock, non-livestock, and everything 4-H!

NOTE: Dog pre-entries are due into the Extension Office by June 29. Dog show will be July 7 at the Multi-County Dog show held at the Gray County Fair Building.

As we start the count down to Fair (it is just a few weeks away), please read your Fair Book for division, number of allowed exhibits per class, class rules and if you have questions, please give any of us a call or email and we will try to help. Don't be afraid to ask questions. The best advice that seasoned 4-H families would probably share with new 4-H families is to just relax and enjoy the fair. Not everything will go perfectly the first year, but you will learn a lot. 4-H promotes "Learn by Doing" both in our project work and in our activities. The consultation judging process is an opportunity for you to learn from another person who is hired to share their expertise and to make a decision at the end. Hopefully they will share some ideas and ask you to think about other ways something could be done.

Keep in mind that when you bring an item to the fair you are asking for it to be evaluated. The other option would be everyone gets the same ribbon and we just display all the projects - would you learn anything and would that be any fun? The fair provides a learning process that will hopefully help us see another person's point of view. Please put forth your best effort and accept the judge's decisions with grace and respect. Always work to "Make the Best Better".

Remember there is no stupid or dumb question, so don't hesitate to ask!

If you haven't received your pre-entry forms in the mail, please come by the office before July 2nd to fill them out! That is the last date to submit your preentries for the 2018 Ford County Fair! You need to submit one if you plan on entering any 4-H project in the fair.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED...FAIR SUPERINTENDENTS

What is a SUPERINTENDENT? A Superintendent is someone who assists judges during entry day on July 19th. They also assist in creating the display for the project area. We encourage Livestock Superintendents to assist with their respective livestock weigh-in and out in the ring during the show. These are great leadership activities for your record book!

What if I'm new and do not know what I'm doing? No problem! Jumping in and volunteering as a superintendent is a GREAT way to learn about 4-H and that project area!

If you did not sign-up and would still like to help out, please give us a call at the office.

A Superintendent list is enclosed and we are still needing helpers in several areas.

4-H SUPERINTENDENT MEETING

A brief superintendent meeting will be held for **ALL adult superintendents on Thursday, July 19 at 7:00 am.** The meeting will review your job description, the 4-H ribbon system, 4-H entry card, and any major division rule changes. ALL adult superintendents are highly encouraged to attend this meeting so that the judging of exhibits runs smoothly! **We still need superintendents!** We rely on our superintendents to ensure that fair goes smoothly, please don't underestimate the importance of these positions. LIVESTOCK PREMIUM AUCTION & SALE

If you are exhibiting livestock that you wish to sell at auction during the fair, it is **YOUR** responsibility to personally invite individuals, businesses, or organizations to come to the auction and bid on your premium and/ or animal. Please take the time to invite them properly, i.e. dress well, give them an invitation, best behavior/manners, thank them for their time, etc.

CHAMPION FOODS

The Grand Champion 4-H foods will sell before the livestock during the Premium Sale on Monday evening of the Fair. All Grand champions food winners are invited to participate. You will be asked to make a fresh food product for your premium buyer but it does not have to be made for the auction. This is optional.

FAIR SUPPLIES

Photo matte boards, arts & crafts cards, Cloverbud entry tags and clothing tags are available at the Extension Office. Please note that the photo matte is \$1.25 per sheet.

FAIR FORMS

Style Revue forms (NEW FORM—Clothing and Textiles Presentation Evaluation Scorecard and Style Revue Description Form and Cost Per Wear—Sr. only) are to be brought to the judging on **Monday, July 16 before 9:30 am.** They can be found on our website or stop by the Extension Office. They may be turned in ahead of time to the office.

CONFERENCE JUDGING

Several 4-H projects are judged in what is considered "conference" style. This is where the 4-H'er visits with the judge to discuss the project, i.e., how it was made, why they made it that way, what they learned, etc. 4-H has always been known for teaching public speaking, confidence, and communication skills. What an awesome way to instill these qualities in our youth! *We encourage parents to sit at a distance to observe, thus allowing the youth to be solely responsible for presenting the project to the judge.* 4-H'ers will be able to sign-up for conference judging when they check in their projects. Conference judging will start shortly after 10:00am on Thursday, July 19.

WHAT IF I FORGOT TO PRE-ENTER SOMETHING?

Each 4-H member will be given 1 (and only 1) "freebie" entry tag. It may be used in any project area that you are enrolled in, but remember each child is only given ONE, so in the event that you need to use it, use it wisely! (For example...Suzy pre-entered one color photo on her pre-entry sheet on July 2nd. However, when Suzy showed up to Entry Day at the Fair on July 21st, she had two colored photos that she would like to exhibit. Suzy had two choices 1—take one photo home and enter the other in the fair or 2– use her free-bie card to be able to enter both colored photos in the fair.) Exhibits that utilize the freebie entry card are not eligible for a purple or champion award. Freebies may not be used for livestock that was not weighed in. Plan ahead and pre-enter correctly so you don't end up in a bind.

2018 FAIR SPECIAL CONTESTS

4-H'ers are eligible to enter the Special Contests, which are Barn Quilts, King Arthur Flour Bar Cookies, and Container Garden contests during the 2018 Ford County Fair.

4-H KING & QUEEN CONTEST

Every club should have nominated two members for King & Queen contestants for this year's contest! Contestants will need to decorate a coffee can to display at the Fair. If you do not have the can form and other information, please contact Ethel. The King and Queen candidate who earns the most money will be crowned King and Queen at the Livestock Sale the last day of the fair. ALL contestants are encouraged to ride on the 4-H Float in the Dodge City Days Parade on July 28. All money raised will go to the our 4-H Exchange Program.

The Ford County 4-H Ambassador's are asking 4-H'ers over the age of 11 to ride on the 4-H float during the Dodge City Days Parade and help promote 4-H. All members who would like to participate should come to the Civic Center by 9am on Saturday, July 28 and look for the 4-H float..

Trailer Parking during Fair

Enclosed is a map with information concerning parking during the fair. The map shows trailer and camper parking areas as well as the extended livestock tie out area. Please note there is no driving around in the back of the fairgrounds during the Horse Show. If you think you might need to leave, please park your vehicle north of the building prior to Saturday morning. Please refer back to rule number 1 on page 14 of the Fairbook. This is to help maintain a more orderly and safe fair. If you are planning to have a camper during fair, we ask you to park on the east side, south of the horse arena and to let the office know so we are aware of who has campers.

FAIR THANK YOU'S REQUIRED

Because each and every one of our **Fair sponsors is very special and deserves special recognition**, the Fair Board is requiring all 4-H'ers to turn in handwritten, stamped and addressed thank-you's before any trophies or premium monies will be given. Thank you's for the Fair Board, Extension Office, 4-H Foundation or 4-H Council do not need postage put on them.

As in the past, 4-H'ers will **NOT** be receiving their checks the night of the premium sale. Each 4-H'er will receive a letter in the mail a few weeks after the Fair with a list of who they need to write thank you's to. To receive your premium check, you must bring in handwritten, stamped and addressed thank you's to the Extension Office.

Thank you's should be written for any trophies, showmanship money, special awards, and anything else that the 4-H'er won. Clubs and/or families can also do a thank you for general donations instead of each 4-H'er writing one. We will have a special thank you that will need to be signed the night of Fair Set-Up and Clean-up that will cover general donations that pertain to everyone (for example, Victory Electric for t-shirts). If you are not sure if a thank you is needed, feel free to ask. Our sponsors are invaluable – show your appreciation!!
