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# FAIR UPDATE...

County Fair is just a few short weeks away!! As we start the count down to Fair please read your Fair Book for class rules and if you have questions, please give any of us a call or email and we will try to help. Don't be afraid to ask questions. The best advice that seasoned 4-H families would probably share with new 4-H families is to just relax and enjoy the Fair. Not everything will go perfectly the first year, but you will learn a lot. 4-H promotes "Learn by Doing" both in our project work and in our activities. The consultative judging process is an opportunity for you to learn from another person who is hired to share their expertise and to make a decision at the end. Hopefully they will share some ideas and ask you to think about other ways something could be done.

Keep in mind, when you bring an item to the fair you are asking for it to be evaluated. The other option would be everyone gets the same ribbon and we just display all the projects - would you learn anything and would that be any fun? The fair provides a learning process which will hopefully help us see another person's point of view. Please put forth your best effort and accept the judge's decisions with grace and respect. Always work to "Make the Best Better".

Remember there is no stupid or dumb question, so don't hesitate to ask! If you are a new family and are not sure about something, PLEASE call and ask!

# INDOOR EXHIBIT DROP OFF TIMES—JULY 17

This will be set up in the middle room of the Fair Building by the north door entrance. Please plan to enter using the north door. The procedure will be the

same as previous years with drop off exhibits by exhibitor's last name. We rotate check in times by last names and will continue in the future so the same families are not always first or last. If this time absolutely does not work, contact the Extension office to make other arrangements. Once you come in the door, one of the Extension Staff members will ask you what you brought and

will check in the exhibits We will then print your entry cards once you are check in. You will need

to attach cards to your exhibit, and then take each exhibit to the project department area in the Fair Building. All project areas have signs indicating the project name to help you find the right area.

#### PHOTOGRAPY FAIR JUDGING- 2025

All Photography entries will be judged on Monday morning, July 14 at the Ford County Fair Building. Entries will be accepted starting at 8:30 a.m. with consultative judging beginning at 9:30 a.m. All entries must be in by 10 am . Photos will be kept after judging and will then be displayed with ribbons on Thursday, July 17 after judging of other exhibits starts.

**Need help with mounting your photos for the fair?** Kylene Scott will be holding a session on how to mount photos at the Ford County Fair Building on this coming Wednesday, July 9 at 5:30 –6:30 p.m. If you are not sure how to put the photos on the matt board (what adhesive, how far down, etc), then come and she will have supplies and help you to do this before the Fair or if you do not have your photos yet, come and learn how to do this on your own later prior to fair. We will also have mount boards available there or you can come into the office and pick them up. They are \$1.50 per board.

#### FASHION REVIEW JUDGING—July 14, evening

We will have Fashion Review Judging for Constructed Garments and Shopping in Style for Girls and Boys on **Monday evening, July 14 starting at 6:00 pm.** Everyone is asked to come in their Shopping in Style outfit and be ready to model. If you have entered in Construction Style Review, bring your outfit to change into after Shopping in Style judging is done. Here is a tentative schedule. ## RABBIT AND POULTRY

All Poultry and Rabbits needs to be checked in and on the Fairgrounds between 7:30– 10:00 am on Thursday, July 17. The Fair's **Rabbit Show** will be on **Friday, July 18 at 11:00 am**. Rabbits will stay on the Fairgrounds this year. <u>Poultry show</u> will be held on **Friday, July 18 at 11:30 a.m**. All Poultry and Rabbits will be housed in the Poultry/Rabbit Barn during the Fair. We do not need to do Poultry Testing this year.

### HAND PET SHOW

The Hand Pet Show is scheduled for **Friday afternoon**, **July 18 at 3 p.m**. Registration will start at 2:30 pm in the west end of the Fair Building. Order of judging will be cats, aquarium pets, dog, hand pets. Be sure to bring your health papers on cats and dogs. Animals must be kept in appropriate carrier or on a leash.

### **4-H SUPERINTENDENTS**

We are going to try a zoom for our Fair Superintendent training this year. We have it scheduled for Wednesday, July 9 at 12:30 pm and it will be recorded for those that can not attend live and posted on our website. Zoom link — <u>https://ksu.zoom.us/j/92592390733</u> to join. We will review your job description, the 4-H ribbon system, 4-H entry card, and any major division rule changes. We would like superintendents on Thursday, July 17 to be at their area by 10:00 –10:15 am, but can come earlier if you want. We will start our judging at 11:30 am, so you may want to eat lunch before it starts.

We rely on our superintendents to ensure that fair goes smoothly, please don't underestimate the importance of these positions. Contact the office ASAP if you are willing to help out! Superintendent assignment sheet is enclosed and it indicates where we might still need help. I think I got all the submitted names added, but <u>please reach</u> out if your name is not on the list and you thought you signed up! I may have just missed it.

#### NO LIVESTOCK PREMIUM AUCTION

We will again have the Pillars of the Community Event (replace the old Fair Premium Sale) on Saturday, August 9, doors open at 5:00 pm. RSVP's for the meal/event are due by July 21 for 4-H families by emailing to fordcountypillars@gmail.com or by texting to 620-682-5008. Tickets can be picked up at the Fair or from Brooklyn Droste. Parent ticket cost is \$30.

The Fair Board will provide market buyers if you do want to market your animals and not take them back home.

#### ADULT CELEBRITY SHOWMANSHIP

A reminder for those senior division livestock showmen to get their celebrity showmen form turned into Mike Martinez as soon as possible, if you haven't already sent it to him. This is being held on Friday, July 18 at 6:30 pm This is taking the place of the former Adult Showmanship. Information was sent to community leaders and was in the past couple of month's 4-H newsletters. If you need more information or the entry form, contact the Extension Office.

#### **CHAMPION FOODS**

The Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions 4-H foods in each age division will still have the opportunity to sell by auction at the Pillars of the Community event on August 9. You will be asked to make a fresh food product for your buyer. To participate in the auction is optional for the winners.

#### **CONSULTATIVE JUDGING**

Consultative Judging will take place at the Fair. You will have a chance to sign up for a time to visit with the judge after Fair set up on Tuesday evening or when you bring your exhibits on Thursday. Consultative judging is an approach to evaluating project exhibits that allows the judge and 4-H member to communicate one-to-one throughout the judging process. The 4-H member has a chance to explain what and how they made their exhibit and why they did it a certain way. Consider taking this opportunity to learn from the judge! This is optional when having your exhibit judged. 4-H has always been known for teaching public speaking, confidence, and communication skills. What an awesome way to instill these qualities in our youth! We encourage parents to sit at a distance to observe, thus allowing the youth to be solely responsible for presenting the project to the judge.

#### FAIR RIBBONS AND TROPHIES

Just a reminder, for when you pickup your exhibits at the end of the Fair. If your exhibit has a sticker indicating the ribbon placing, you can request an actual ribbon at the Fair Office in the building prior to leaving. If you received a Grand Champion on one of your exhibits, you can request a trophy instead of receiving a monetary premium for the exhibit. All requests for a trophy must be made in writing and submitted to an Extension Agent at the end of the County Fair. All Fair Ribbon Premiums are usually available (after submitting thank you's) in late August and you will receive a letter detailing your premium and what thank you notes are needed for. If you have questions, please contact our office.

WHAT IF I FORGET SOMETHING? Each 4-H member is allowed one (1) "freebie" entry tag. It may be used in any project area that you are enrolled in, but remember each child is only given ONE, so in the event that you need to use it, use it wisely! (For example...Suzy pre-entered one color photo on her FairEntry pre-entry by July 1. However, when Suzy showed up to Entry Day at the Fair, she had two colored photos that she would like to exhibit. She had two choices 1—take one photo home and enter the other in the fair or 2- use her freebie card to be able to enter both colored photos in the fair.) Exhibits that utilize the freebie entry card are <u>not</u> eligible for a purple or champion award. The "freebie" may not be used for livestock that were not weighed in at their respective spring weigh-ins or projects that youth are not enrolled in.

### HELP NEEDED FOR FAIR SET-UP

Volunteers help us have a successful county fair. We need everyone's help to get things ready prior to the actual fair! Check with other club members and make sure your club is represented. Parents and 4-H members are needed to help Fair Board members with <u>set up on Tuesday evening, July 15 at 5:30 pm.</u> Please bring gloves, rakes, brooms, hoses, buckets, rags, weed eaters, etc. to help clean out the barns, clean displays, racks, and other things in the fair building. It won't take long if everyone comes to help. Pizza for all who help! Stall assignments and t-shirts will be handed out after set up is complete. Club Booths can also be set up after everything is done.

#### AFTER FAIR CLEAN UP AND POOL PARTY!!!! This is on Wednesday after Fair.

On <u>Wednesday evening</u>, July 23 at 5:30 pm. we will be having the after Fair clean up. The Ford County Fair Association has arranged for a swimming party at the Dodge City Lagoon Water Park after clean up. The Ford County 4-H Foundation has offered to pay the admission fee for 4-H members and their families who come and help with clean up. Everyone who helps with clean up will be provided a ticket or wrist band to get into the Water Park for free. Those unable to help with clean up but would like to join us will need to pay the admission fee. Supper will be provided after clean up and prior to the swim party.

### 4-H KING & QUEEN CONTEST

Every club should have nominated members for King & Queen contestants for this year's contest! Contestants will need to decorate a coffee can to display at the Fair. Ethel gave out information to all the club leaders at the last Council meeting. If you don't have the information, please contact Ethel at the office. The King and Queen candidate who earns the most money will be crowned King and Queen on Sunday, July 20 around 5:00 pm. ALL contestants are encouraged to ride on the 4-H Float in the Dodge City Days Parade on July 26. If other 4-H'ers would like to ride on the float, please let Ethel know so we can provide information on time and location to meet. King and Queen candidates for all of the clubs will have their decorated can at the County Fair for donations started on Thursday, July 17. Cans are usually located on a table in the middle room of the Fair Building during the Fair, and donations will be accepted until 4 pm Sunday, July 20 . This is a fundraiser for the 4-H Exchange Group.

## STATE FAIR DEADLINES

July 15 — the <u>entry</u> deadline for the Kansas State Fair for Beef, Sheep, Goats and Swine.

August 1 — State Fair Horse entries are due.

August 8 — All other <u>State Fair 4-H **pre-entries** are due</u> in the Extension Office & State Fair Volunteer sign up The earlier the better on pre-entries submission. Remember if you receive a blue ribbon or higher at county fair you can show your exhibit at the State Fair as long as there is a division/class for it and you are 9 or older. Not all county fair exhibits have a corresponding class at the State Fair. There are also restrictions to number of entries with it usually be only one entry per division/class. Those that received a blue or higher at county club day on public presentations can also give their talk/demo at the State Fair. Ask the office for more information.

Actual exhibit must be brought into the Extension Office by Friday, August 29 Foods and Horticulture brought between 7:30 am – 8 a.m. on Thursday, Sept. 4 to Extension Office Parking lot. Judging will take place that day at State Fair. **<u>2025 FAIR SPECIAL CONTESTS</u>** — 4-H'ers are eligible to enter the Special Contests, which are Photo (theme of All American Fun), Barn Quilts, and a Building Creation contests during the 2025 Ford County Fair.

# **TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR 4-H PARENTS**

- 3. Thou shalt not get mad when thy child forgets items for thy project exhibit, for one day thou may forget something, too.
- 4. Thou shalt help the fair board for they are doing a job that thou would not want to do.
- Thou shalt see that thy child is on time for all activities for thou shalt not want to wait for another.
- Thou shalt ensure that thy child has the project exhibit entered and the entry papers in order by the designated time.
- Thou shalt teach thy child that winning a blue ribbon is desirable goal, but making friends along the way is more a worthy goal.
- 8. Thou shalt not complain about the judge, for it is his/her opinion that has been sought.
- 9. Thou shalt not forget that all exhibits are a part of a teaching project, not moneymaking.
- 10. Thou shalt remember that a 4-H project is a family project that shall be enjoyed & supported by the entire family all year long.
