# **INVITE A FRIEND TO 4-H!**

In the spirit of National 4-H Week, we challenge each of you to invite a friend to your October and November 4-H meetings! The best way to grow your club and the Ford County 4-H Program is to share your passion for 4-H with your friends! Help us increase Ford County and your 4-H Club's enrollment!

### **ONLINE 4-H MEMBER ENROLLMENT**

4-H Member Enrollment started October 1. This year you will need to select your club and then your projects when you enroll. The Club with the most re-enrollments of current members by November 15 will receive a pizza party.



All new and re-enrolling members and volunteers will need to go to the following website to enroll for the new year —  $\frac{\text{http://v2.4honline.com}}{\text{http://v2.4honline.com}}$ .

The State 4-H Office has had some issues with the online system when it first opened. If you tried to enroll on October 1, you may have had your enrollment sent back with a message to re-enroll. Please let us know if you have any issues.

#### MEMBERSHIP ENROLLMENT FEE AND PAYMENT PROCEDURES

Remember the State 4-H Office has a \$15 per member fee. At the end of each 4-H'er enrollment there will be a screen concerning the fee and payment options. Options on the screen will include: Debit/credit card, check and waiver. If you have more than one child and do not want several debit/credit card transactions you will need to indicate check otherwise each will be it's own transaction. A second transaction does not always go through as it might be considered as a fraudulent transaction. The enrollment fee can be paid through the Extension Office, but you will need to indicate payment by check. So you can pay with credit card or check, which ever you prefer. If your club is paying for member's enrollment please indicate check and the office will put in the code prior to approval. Clubs will then pay 4-H Council.

If your family is paying the fee, you can also indicate payment by check and you can pay the Extension office. We will then insert the coupon code prior to approval. Please do not mail your check to the State 4-H Office as the process will take longer.

Enrollment will not become active until approved by our county and state 4-H offices. If you have any questions, please contact our office. There are instructions on our website for re-enrolling. It is very important to keep things like mailing addresses, phone numbers current and list your service provider in the online system. This is our means of communicating with you if you want to receive text messages and phone calls. You may need to let the office know if something needs to be changed and we will make that correction. Also if you would like your kids to receive the newsletter by email, list their email address in the individual profile information. This will allow 4-H'ers as well as families to receive newsletters.

If you can't recall which email address you used to set up your account, give us a call or send us an email and we will help you out. Do NOT create a new family account. If your password doesn't work, you will need to reset it.

All State 4-H Projects will be listed this year in the online enrollment. You can only enroll in projects available due to instructor restrictions for some projects — example some shooting sports disciples. If you are not sure, check with us.

#### 4-H CLOVERBUDS

Ford County 4-H offers the Cloverbud (5-6 year olds who are too young to join 4-H) program.

**Cloverbuds should only enroll in the Cloverbud project.** Below are the policies and guidelines that the Kansas Cloverbud program follows:

- 4-H Cloverbuds is activity-focused, rather than project-focused.
- The 4-H Cloverbuds programming is cooperative, rather than competitive.
- 4-H Cloverbud exhibits can be showcased at fairs or public events, but a 4-H Cloverbuds member may not participate as a competitive exhibitor in traditional 4-H events.
- A 4-H Cloverbud member may showcase a pet from the approved pet list: Amphibians, Ant farms, Cat, Dog, Fish, Gerbils, Guinea Pigs, Hamsters, Mice, Parakeets, Rabbits, Rats
- The 4-H Cloverbud members do not manage money.

## **Important NOTE When Enrolling:**

As we begin the 2025–2026 4-H year, it's important to understand how publicity permissions are handled and how we, as Extension professionals, can responsibly share the stories and successes of you, our 4-H members.



#### What Is the Publicity Release?

When families enroll in 4-H Online, they are asked to agree (or not agree) to a publicity release. This release gives permission for the use of a member's name, image, and likeness by:

- Local Extension Units
- Kansas State University (including the State 4-H Office)
- The Kansas 4-H Foundation

This includes use in photos, videos, social media, websites, press releases, and more. If a family selects "I Do Not Agree," their child's name and image cannot be used. Some examples include:

- Kansas State Fair & County Fair entry cards, schedules, or results
- Local or state contests
- Social media posts
- News articles or promotional materials

#### **Additional Consent Questions**

To provide more clarity, families are asked to give specific permission for:

- First and last name
- Extension unit
- 4-H club or town name
- Media (photos, video, audio, etc.)
- Print-only media
- Social media
- County fair-related publicity

These responses override the general publicity release and help guide what can or cannot be shared publicly.

Best Practices for Sharing Youth Information for Extension Professionals Even when full permission is granted, it is best practice to:

- Use first names only in social media posts.
- If no consent is given, refer to youth as:
- ◆ "A 4-H member from [Club Name]"
- Or use initials, e.g., "C.C., participant from Cloverville 4-H Club"

These practices help protect youth privacy while still celebrating their achievements.

### 4-H AMBASSADOR/EXCHANGE MTG

The next Ambassador/Exchange meeting will be Monday, October 27th @7:00 pm. NEW members are welcome! Officer elections will take place for the new year.

This dynamic group works with the promotion of 4-H to the public and within our own organization here in Ford County. The Exchange program is designed to help youth gain more independence, a greater appreciation for other parts of the state and country, meet new friends and have new experiences. It is a two year commitment and we suggest you enroll in the Self Determined project. Youth must be 12 and older to be an Ambassador and 14 and older to be involved with the State to State Exchange.



The group will be traveling or hosting in 2026. We are in the process of confirming an exchange commitment with another State Exchange program. Call Ethel if you would like more information.

The Exchange group will be hosting a Fall Flea Market/Garage Sale on October 18, 9 am to 1:00 pm at the Ford County Fair Building. This is one of the group's major fund raising activities.

# EXTENSION ANNUAL ELECTION AND DODGE CITY MAIN STREET UPDATE PRESENTATION

The Ford County Extension Program Development Committee Election meeting will be held <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>October 29</u>, <u>7:00 pm</u> with the Election and then a presentation on Dodge City Main Street presentation by Hugo Hernandez, at the meeting. This will be at the Ford County Fair Building, Dodge City. To be eligible to vote you must be 18 or older and a resident of Ford County.

Election voting will take place from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm at the Extension Office and also from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm at the Ford County Fair Building. Results of the election will be announced after the Streetscape presentation.

Elections will be for the four programming areas (Agriculture and Natural Resources; Family and Consumer Sciences; 4-H Youth Development; and Community Vitality) and candidates elected will serve a two-year term. Short candidate bio's will be posted on our website the week prior to the election and will be available during the election voting times.

#### 4-H CLUB OFFICER TRAINING—date to be determined.

<u>All newly elected officers</u> are invited to attend an Officers Training workshop. We are working on this training and will send out more information as soon as everything is finalized. Be watching for an email announcing the date, time and location soon.

State Fair entries are in the Extension Office. If you are not able to pick up your projects, please let the office know who you have asked to collect them.

## PROJECT SELECTION

It is very important to sit down as a family to select 4-H projects for the upcoming year. **4-H IS A FAMILY AFFAIR,** so time required, costs involved, parental help, etc. should all be carefully considered when selecting projects. It is usually recommended to take only a few projects. A 4-H project is designed to encompass the entire 4-H year, including project meetings, special events/contests, individual time, fair exhibits, record books, etc. 4-H Project Selection Guides are on our website or from the Extension Office.
