LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN DATES

If you are planning on showing livestock this year at the County Fair, you MUST weigh and tag your livestock at the respective weigh-in dates. **Beef weigh-in** has been set for February 6 from 4:00-6:00 p.m. at Winter Livestock. In case of bad weather that day, it will be moved to February 13. You will be notified if it changes. Small livestock weigh-in will be April 14, 4:30-6:30 p.m. at the Fair-grounds.

A service charge of \$25 will be applied per trip to tag animals for **other shows** not brought to respective weigh-in dates. What if the 4-H'er is unable to be at the weigh-in? No worries, the ANIMAL can be brought to the weigh-in by anyone. If you have questions, just let us know!

4-H ENROLLMENTS

This is your last call to get your 4-H on-line updated for 2020. Even if you are enrolling in the same projects, you will still need to log-on and update. **Volunteers need to update their profiles, too!** <u>This will be the last month that we will send out the newsletter if you have not re-enrolled.</u> You will be able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie.

VIP (Volunteer Information Profile)

Each 4-H volunteer working directly with youth in the club, is required to go through this screening and training process. Any Exchange families hosting this year will also need both parents to go through the process. Beginning in the 2019-2020 4-H program year, the 4-H Volunteer process has been streamlined. When 4-H Volunteers enroll through 4HOnline the process will take the place of what once was the volunteer application and then reenrollment forms. Once volunteers enter their information in the system, they will simply have to reenroll each year, the same way youth currently do through 4HOnline. CHANGES IN 4-H HORSE PROGRAM

The 4-H Horse Action Team has been discussing several issues with the team, agents and volunteers during the past few years concerning the Kansas 4-H Horse program as the team has been in the process of revising the rule book that is to be released during the 4-H Horse Panorama.

Ownership - Youth may own the horse themselves, or use a family-owned horse (immediate family: parent, stepparent, brother, sister, stepsibling, grandparent, or legal guardian).

Rationale – family dynamics have changed, therefore providing the most opportunities for youth. Leasing - If a 4-H member identifies a family-owned horse, 1 additional horse may be leased and identified. Rationale – Families with multiple youth cannot always share a horses, plus leasing provides youth an opportunity try another training method offered through 4-H.

Entering District Horse Shows - 4-H members may participate in their county/district designated District Horse Show plus one additional District Horse Show of their choosing. But before entering the Kansas State Fair, 4-H members must indicate through which District Horse Show. There will be no picking of classes from each district, only results from one of the districts attended will be used.

Rationale – Youth have conflicts and bad days, providing another opportunity increases potential mastery. Senior Horse Western Pleasure – Eliminated

Rationale – Class was based on horse's age causing conflict.

Junior Horse Western Pleasure – Eliminated

Rationale – Class was based on horse's age causing conflict.

Ranch Horse Pattern and Reining – Patterns changed.

Costume, Roping Classes – All information to be added to the web site and not included in the rule book. **Two Year Old Snafflebit** - Reminder it was phased out.

Finally, with input and cooperation from the East Central District, the number of District Horse Shows has been reduced from 7 to 6 districts – Northeast, Southeast, North Central, South Central, Northwest and Southwest. The counties/districts that made-up the East Central District have been reassigned to the Northeast and Southeast Districts.

The 2020 4-H Horse Panorama is scheduled for January 24 – 26, at Rock Springs 4-H Center. 4-H Horse members are encouraged to register to participate in quiz bowl, hippology, presentations and more. All competitive events are open to those members that are age 9 as of December 31, 2019 and not past age 19 as of December 31, 2019. JUNIOR BEEF PRODUCER DAY REGISTRATION OPEN

Join us February 29, 2020, for the Kansas Junior Beef Producer Day in Weber Arena on the Kansas State University campus. This event will be a fun-filled, educational day of activities in which youth, parents, beef project leaders, and extension agents can broaden their knowledge of youth beef projects. Presentations and demonstrations by K-State faculty, staff, K-State livestock judging team members, and guest speakers will cover topics such as selection, nutrition, meat science, reproduction, health, grooming, and showmanship. An optional YQCA certification session will be offered at the end of the day. A complimentary lunch and t-shirt (early registrations) will be provided. Cost: \$15/person

by February 7 or \$20/person after February 7. *Registrations received after Feb. 7 cannot be guaranteed a tshirt. To Register Online: <u>http://bit.ly/ksuasiregister</u>.

There will also be an opportunity for youth to become certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA), which is the new, national, multi-specie youth livestock quality assurance program required for exhibitors participating in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS). The optional instructor-led YQCA session will take place at the conclusion of each junior producer day.

CITIZENSHIP IN ACTION

Would you like to have more influence in laws and rules that affect your life? Then you'll want to go to Kansas 4-H Citizenship in Action! This two-day event is sponsored by the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council. The purpose of the event is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in their local communities. The legislative visit will not only familiarize youth with the capitol building, but will also show them how they can affect the legislative process. CIA will be February 16 –17, 2020 in Topeka, KS. Youth 13-18 years old by January 1 of the current year are eligible to attend. Registration Deadline is January 15, 2020.

STATE 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS DUE IN EARLY 2020

All scholarships must be submitted in full and should be on the 2020 Kansas 4-H Scholarship Application which can be found at <u>http://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/4-h-library/awards-and-recognition/</u><u>scholarships.html</u>. The KS 4-H Scholarship requires a copy of your grade transcript, several letters of recommendation and an essay, so plan ahead! Any past 4-H member who is currently in college is eligible to apply for the KS 4-H scholarships. You are considered for all scholarships that you qualify for with one application.

Please note that the mail system takes several extra days to get to the State 4-H Office. State Scholarship application must go through our office and it needs an agent's signature. Therefore, our due date for State Scholarships to be turned into the Ford County Extension Office is Wednesday, January 22. The 2020 Scholarships must be in the State 4-H Office on February 1, 2020

HOW DO I REGISTER?

MODEL MEETING

- Model Meeting club and 1 or 2 adults
 This event allows clubs to act out a 'proper business meeting' which 4-H Clubs do each month at their regular 4-H Club Meeting. In this event, clubs must include 5 parliamentary practices found in the 'Club Days Guidelines.'
 Two additional topics will be drawn at the competition and must be included during the competition. Please contact the office for more information.
- •Gavel Games 4-6 members

This is a great way for youth to practice parliamentary procedure in a fun atmosphere. Please see the 'Club Days Guidelines' for complete rules and information.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

- •Show & Tell 1st or 2nd yr. junior members only This event is as simple as bringing your favorite toy and telling the judge all about it.
- •**Project Talk** junior members only Gain confidence by talking to a judge about your favorite project in 4-H. Visuals are encouraged.
- •Public Speaking senior members only Take the next step and write your own speech on a topic of your choice. 15 min max.
- •Extemporaneous Speaking senior members only Participant draws two topics at competition and chooses one of them to speak on. 15 min prep time.

Digital Presentation

Put your PowerPoint skills to work! This event can be on a 4-H Project or topic of your choice.

Demonstration

Show the judge how to make a smoothie, sew on a button, or groom your dog in REAL life!

Illustrated Talk Readings

Show the judge how to do something by using pictures or drawings.

DANCE:

•Folk Step Dance - group

May include circle, line, Irish, polka dance etc.

•Square Dance - group

Kick-off your shoes for some good ol' fashioned square dancing! 10 min max.

•Other Dance - individual or group Are you in ballet, tap, cheerleading, clogging, etc? Then this is for you!

DRAMATICS:

•One Act Play - group

This is FUN for a club to do! Grab a script and practice, practice, practice! Only one scene set allowed.

•Skit - group

This is also fun for creative minds. Make up your own skit and put costumes and a set to it!

•Novelty - individual or group

Are you in gymnastics? Do you like to do ventriloquists acts, stunts, puppets or other forms of entertainment?

•Vocal Performance - a solo or group (2 or more) perform a musical piece; sheet music not required for the judges.

Do you have a favorite song from band or vocal in school that you'd love to share for a judge? If so, enter it for Club Days! 4-H'ers must have sheet music for judges. An ensemble has 2-5 4-H'ers participating.
