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

We need you to register before you can attend any 4-H events, and to keep you up to date on what's happening with 4-H in Ford County! We believe there is less payment issues if you indicate paying with coupon and pay locally to our office instead of paying by credit card.

4-H Volunteer Screening

A registered 4-H Volunteer is a volunteer, adult or teen, who has completed the full screening process including: application, screening, orientation and has received approval. For the safety of both 4-H members and adults, this system is in place. Each volunteer will also have to have a background check done in order to be approved. Each year, NEW 4-H volunteers must apply for certification, or in the case of a returning volunteer, renew their status via a renewal form. Both are available through the KS 4-H Online website. Contact the office for questions.

Who needs to be certified?

- Community Leaders
- Cloverbud Leaders
- Project Leaders (Teen, Club, County, etc)
- Camp Counselors
- Any person who will be in contact with 4-H youth for more than 6 hours.

We will not approve your online enrollment until we have received your volunteer application or volunteer renewal form!

Volunteers must complete the volunteer process to be recognized as a leader at the Achievement program next year.

NEW RECORD BOOKS FORMS FOR 2021!!!

Ford County 4-H will no longer be using the Kansas Award Portfolio (KAP) record form. The state 4-H program is moving to a new state wide record book keeping and project end of the year report form.

We will be hosting a training on the new forms, soon, but basically there will be two forms per age group — one general project form and one animal project form. You can check out the new forms on our website at: https://www.ford.k-state.edu/4-h/4hrecordbooks/recordbookforms.html

We will continue to use the Personal Page and Permanent Record forms previously used in the past.

Record Keeping & Project Report Forms

Record keeping and Project Reporting are valuable skills taught to members of the Kansas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep a permanent record of all 4-H and Non-4-H Experience and are encouraged to summarize their experiences on the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form for project recognition.

To help you through this process, please refer to the <u>Guide</u> <u>to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition</u>, at https://www.ford.k-state.edu/4-h/4hrecordbooks/recordbookforms.html found on our website on the top right hand side.

VERY IMPORTANT: Before you begin to keep project record reports for the year, please make sure you have a current version of Adobe Reader DC. If you do not, you may download a free version, here: https://get.adobe.com/reader/. When you click on that link and "Uncheck" the 3 boxes in the middle column and click on the link to begin your download. Follow the prompts to download and install Adobe Acrobat Reader DC.

Winter 2021 Pen Pal Program

Meeting

States' 4-H International Exchange Programs is launching the online registration for its second Pen Pal Program on November 16! **Registration closes December 11, 2020.** Space is limited on a first-come, first-serve basis, so don't delay.

Program Details:

- 1. The Pen Pal program will run from Jan 18 April 18, 2021.
- 2. Participants must be between the ages of 9-18 and from an active States' 4-H state. Kansas 4-H members may participate.
- 3. There is no cost for participation.
- 4. Participants sign up by completing an online registration form, which includes a Terms of Use agreement.
- 5. States' 4-H will match participants with an international peer from one of the participating countries. States' 4-H will make its best effort to match based on country preference, age, gender, and interests. Matching information will be distributed to participants between December 18 January 11, 2021.
- 6. Participants are asked to communicate at least **two** times per month with their international pen pal.
- 7. A positive and enthusiastic attitude are crucial for this program as it will be up to the US participant to initiate contact with their pen pal.

FORD COUNTY FEE POLICIES

-EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2014

REMINDER OF OUR FEE'S POLICY

- For any activity registration: Payment arrangements can be made in writing with the Extension Office to set up a payment schedule. *Full payment is due by the registration deadline.*
- For online registrations: <u>Full payment is due to the Extension Office by the online event deadline unless a written payment agreement is made between the Extension Office and the participant.</u> Failing to meet those requirements will result in cancellation of registration (participant will still be responsible for the \$25 cancelation fee and possible registration cost based upon event guidelines).
- **Transportation:** A transportation fee of \$10 per person will be added to fees for trips that require travel in a county vehicle outside of Ford County (ex. Advanced Master Gardener Training, State FCE Conference, KS Youth Leadership Forum, Discovery Days, Camp at Rock Springs, judging events, etc.).
- Tagging Livestock: A service fee of \$25 per trip will be charged for trips made to tag livestock for state shows or to re-tag livestock that have lost their original tags.
- Transportation for Other Counties: Ford County will require a \$25 per person to transport participants from other counties to events.

4-H Presentation Overview

Kansas 4-H members have been learning to speak skillfully before an audience for more than 100 years. It is often one of the things people say they most remember about their 4-H experiences — before participating in 4-H, they could not speak comfortably in front of an audience. Through 4-H, thousands of youth have learned the skills necessary to clearly organize and present ideas and instructions through project talks, demonstrations, illustrated talks, and public speaking.

Every 4-H member profits in some way from planning and presenting a project talk, demonstration, illustrated talk, or public speech. Shy, retiring members will develop the ability to express themselves, become part of the group, and develop more interest in 4-H.

Even confident members will learn to organize, to complete a job, and to establish a standard of excellence for themselves and others. Good presenters are made, not born. Presenting is a skill that must be learned, just as other skills are.

Giving presentations in 4-H will teach members many skills that have value later in life, including these marketable skills:

- How to organize thoughts in a logical manner.
- How to find information and research a subject.
- ♦ How to express ideas clearly and convincingly.
- How to prepare visuals and use them to support the presentation.
- ♦ How to listen to the opinions of others and accept feedback.
- How to teach others.
- How to manage time.
- ♦ How to manage stress
