4-H ENROLLMENTS

This is your last call to get your 4-H on-line updated for 2021. **Volunteers need to update their profiles, too!** <u>*This will be the last month that we will*</u> <u>send out the newsletter if you have not re-enrolled by January 31.</u> You are now able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each project.

LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN DATES

If you are planning on showing livestock this year at the County Fair, you MUST weigh and tag your livestock at the respective weigh-in dates. **Beef** weigh-in has not been set yet. Fair Board will be meeting January 12 and it will be decided at that time.

JUNIOR PRODUCER DAY REGISTRATION OPEN

This year the junior producer days will be hosted virtually as week-long educational series. A few sessions will be presented on week-night evenings, with the program wrapping up on Saturday morning. Junior Swine Producer Week is scheduled for February 15-20, 2021. The Junior Meat Goat Producer Week is slated for March 15-20, 2021. All ages and knowledge levels are invited for both events! K-State faculty members, graduate students and guest speakers will cover topics including selection, nutrition and feeding, meat science, livestock guard dogs, health, grooming and clipping, showmanship, and the state livestock nomination process.

The program will be free this year, but all attendees, including youth and adults, must register online. The link for Junior Swine Producer Week is <u>https://bit.ly/KSUJrSwineWeek</u>. Families may register for Junior Meat Goat Producer Day at <u>https://bit.ly/KSUJrMeatGoatWeek</u>. The deadline to register and receive the necessary materials is February 8 and March 8, respectively. Participants are encouraged to use an email they check regularly, as links and program details will be communicated to those registered via email.

NEW PROCESS FOR 2021!

Applications for ALL 2021 Kansas 4-H Scholarships will be collected online. The deadline to complete applications and submit recommendation letters or references is March 1, 2021.

Please note that you will now be required to upload some files that would have previously been emailed. Listed below each scholarship application link are the required files that you will need to upload in addition to completing the application.

While the more detailed applications allow you to begin, close and return/reopen, it is suggested to have your files ready to upload when you start the application process. **ALL DOCUMENTS FOR UPLOAD MUST BE IN .PDF FILE FORMAT.**

Before uploading files, please follow these guidelines for naming your files:

- Start ALL file names with your FIRST INITIAL AND LAST NAME.
- Add the type of document, i.e. Resume, Transcript, Reference
- Example: DRATLIFF Transcript.PDF

PLEASE NOTE – No paper applications or recommendation letters will be accepted.

EVENTS

We left this information for you to think about what you might want to participate in once we determine when and how 2021 Club Day will be conducted. Please note, group activities will probably not be held in person in 2021.

MODEL MEETING

- Model Meeting club and 1 or 2 adults
 This event allows clubs to act out a 'proper business meeting' which 4-H Clubs do each month at their regular 4-H Club Meeting. In this event, clubs must include 5 parliamentary practices found in the 'Club Days Guidelines.'
 Two additional topics will be drawn at the competition and must be included during the competition. Please contact the office for more information.
- •Gavel Games 4 6 members

This is a great way for youth to practice parliamentary procedure in a fun atmosphere. Please see the 'Club Days Guidelines' for complete rules and information.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

- •Show & Tell 1st or 2nd yr. junior members only This event is as simple as bringing your favorite toy and telling the judge all about it.
- •**Project Talk** junior members only Gain confidence by talking to a judge about your favorite project in 4-H. Visuals are encouraged.
- •Public Speaking senior members only Take the next step and write your own speech on a topic of your choice. 15 min max.
- •Extemporaneous Speaking senior members only Participant draws two topics at competition and chooses one of them to speak on. 15 min prep time.

Digital Presentation

Put your PowerPoint skills to work! This event can be on a 4-H Project or topic of your choice.

Demonstration

Show the judge how to make a smoothie, sew on a button, or groom your dog in REAL life!

Illustrated Talk Readings

Show the judge how to do something by using pictures or drawings.

DANCE:

•Folk Step Dance group

May include circle, line, Irish, polka dance etc.

•Square Dance - group

Kick off your shoes for some good ol' fashioned square dancing! 10 min max.

•Other Dance - individual or group

Are you in ballet, tap, cheerleading, clogging, etc? Then this is for you!

DRAMATICS:

•One Act Play group

This is FUN for a club to do! Grab a script and practice, practice, practice! Only one scene set allowed.

•Skit - group

This is also fun for creative minds. Make up your own skit and put costumes and a set to it!

•Novelty - individual or group

Are you in gymnastics? Do you like to do ventriloquists acts, stunts, puppets or other forms of entertainment?

•Vocal Performance - a solo or group (2 or more) perform a musical piece; sheet music not required for the judges.

MUSIC:

Do you have a favorite song from band or vocal in school that you'd love to share for a judge? If so, enter it for Club Days! 4-H'ers must have sheet music for judges. An ensemble has 2-5 4-H'ers participating.

•Vocal Solo or Ensemble

•Chorus 6 or more in group

- Group will sing two songs of their choosing.
- Instrumental Solo or Ensemble

•Band or Orchestra - 6 or more in group
