LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN DATE

If you are planning on showing livestock this year <u>at the County Fair</u>, you MUST weigh and tag your livestock at the respective weigh-in date. What if the 4-H'er is unable to be at the weigh-in? No worries, the ANIMAL can be brought to the weigh-in by anyone. If you have questions, just let us know!

SMALL ANIMAL (SWINE, SHEEP, GOAT, BUCKET CALF)

Tuesday, April 12, 4:30 pm—6:30 pm @ Ford County Fair Grounds
Alternate date is Tuesday, April 19

<u>Animals for state shows</u> that are <u>not brought</u> to respective weigh-in dates, will have a service charge of \$25 applied to tag animals at their farm.

EAR TAG POLICY

4-H Council policy allows a 4-H'er up to six (6) ear tags per species (i.e. up to 6 for beef, 6 for sheep, 6 for goats, 6 for swine). Any tags over the provided six will be at the expense of the 4-H'er and their family.

QUACK ATTACK FUNDRAISER

At your April Club Meetings, your Club Leaders will have Quack Attack Duck Leases for families to sell. The Ford County 4-H Council would appreciate if all clubs can sell duck leases for this fundraiser. Each club received a book of 50 tickets. We can split the books up if the club wants it. These duck leases are for the Q97/Z98 Quack Attack Duck Race to be held on June 4th at the Dodge City Main Street Festival. The funds from each duck lease purchased from a 4-H'er will come back to the Ford County 4-H Council and your 4-H Club. Complete rules about the Duck Race and how to sell duck leases can be obtained by asking your community leaders for the information. The Alley will also be selling leases. ALL Duck Leases and money must be returned to the Extension Office by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, May 27 or to the Community Leader meeting on May 23. The Family who sells the most duck leases by May 27 will win a \$100 gift card! Community Leaders/families will need to keep track of who sells and if you need more duck leases or have further questions, please call us! Please try and sell the books your leaders checked out before requesting additional books. We are being asked to not have as many non-sold ducks within books when we turn them back in.

4-H Council voted to distribute the funds raised by giving 20% to 4-H Council and the rest of the funds distributed by percentage of tickets/funds raised by each individual club. So the more leases you sell the more money your club will receive back.

All entries forms and accompanying fees (\$5.00 per class) must be sent no later than June 10 to the Edwards County Extension Office. All participants MUST HAVE completed 4-H Horse Achievement Level I booklet, and passed written and riding exams by June 10, to enter & complete. Classes are by 4-H'er's age as of 01/01/2022. Be sure to list the correct horse for the class. NO STALLS AVAILABLE this year. RV Hookups are also available: \$25.00 If you want an RV Hookup, please include the fee with your entry payment. T- Shirt Order Form - - due by June 10th also with payment. Again, 4-H members may participate in their county/district designated District Horse Show plus one additional District Horse Show of their choosing.

Horse ID Papers are due into the office by May 1. They must be signed by an Extension Agent. If we are not in the office you will be asked to leave them for a signature. Remember only Level 1 is required to compete at District and State Shows. If you need to complete your Level 1 testing, contact the office.

ADD/DROP DATE IS MAY 1ST!

WHAT DOES ADD/DROP A PROJECT MEAN? When you completed your enrollment on the https:// v2.4honline.com/ website, you selected a project (s) to be "enrolled in for this 4-H Year". This means you are planning to explore/participate/learn about this project and possibly enter something in the fair for that project area. May 1st is your last day to either ADD another project you would like to participate in or DROP a project you already signed up for that you are not interested in anymore. We encourage you to take something for each project that you are enrolled in to the fair; however it is not required. If you don't remember what you signed up for, just go to the https://v2.4honline.com/ website and check, you can then either add or drop projects. After May 1st you will not be able to make changes as that part of the enrollment process will be closed. If you have any questions, please call us-we'd love to help you!

Failing to meet those requirements will result in cancellation of registration (participant will still be responsible for the \$25 cancelation fee and possible registration cost based upon event guidelines.)

• **Transportation:** A transportation fee of \$10 per person will be added to fees for trips that require travel in a county vehicle outside of Ford County.

SCROGGINS STATE 4-H CAMP/EVENT SCHOLARSHIP

All 4-H'ers of Ford and Gray County have the opportunity to apply for the Scroggins State 4-H Camp/Event Scholarship. Campers wishing to attend a State 4-H Camp (i.e. Discovery Days, KYLF, Space Tech Camp, Sewing Camp, etc.) are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Those interested in applying for a Scroggins Camp Scholarship, must fill out the 'Scroggins State Camp/ Event Scholarship Application' by the Camp Registration Deadline. The number and amount of awards will be determined by the individual county, with consideration to existing support, participation, and county need. Selection will be based on expressed need. For project specific camps/events, preference will be given to 4-H'ers enrolled in the project. No more than one scholarship may be received per 4-H'er/per 4-H year (October 1—September 30). Incomplete applications will not be considered. Applications are available on ford.ksu.edu under the 4-H tab or at the Extension Office.

BLAKE STANLEY SCHOLARSHIP

If you are planning to attend 4-Clover Camp, we encourage you to apply for **one of five \$35 scholarships provided by the Blake Stanley Memorial 4-H Scholarship fund**. If you are interested in applying, you must write an essay with a maximum word count of 200. In the essay please answer the following questions:

• Why do you want to go to 4-H Camp?

Why is 4-H important to you?

• Why do you need a scholarship for camp?

Traditional Camp



EXPLORERS - Ages 8-10 (rising 3rd-5th graders)

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

Last month's newsletter had a flier concerning how to obtain your YQCA certification. This is a requirement for the Ford County Fair as well as for State Fair and KS Junior Livestock Show. This must be done by May 1 prior to submitting Beef nominations and June 15 for commercial heifers, market swine, commercial gilts, market lambs, commercial ewes, and ALL meat goats, nominations. Questions, call Andrea at the Extension office. For County Fair purposes it must be completed prior to county fair preentry.

2022 State Livestock Nomination Information Released

The state livestock nomination process is transitioning to an online system this year! This will require families to plan ahead in order to successfully complete their nominations. Moving to an online system will streamline the process from nomination, to show entry, through participating in the state shows. The deadlines have not changed.

The new process includes four (4) primary steps:

- 1.) Purchasing Official DNA Envelopes in Advance through ShoWorks
- 2.) Submitting Animal & Exhibitor Information Online
- 3.) Mailing DNA Envelopes with Submission Receipt
- 4.) Extension Agents & FFA Advisors Approving Nominations Online

Families will need to purchase an official DNA envelope for each animal by the order deadline, which is one (1) week prior to the nomination deadline. This will be April 24 for market beef and June 8 for small livestock and commercial heifers. Old envelopes will not be accepted.

Exhibitors will be prompted to upload their family's 2022 Declaration Form and current YQCA certificate during the online submission process. A child's certificate needs to be good through 10/2/2022 to be valid. Families are encouraged to send their nominations via certified mail. The deadlines have not changed. Market Beef nominations are due May 1. The Small Livestock and Commercial Heifer Deadline is June 15. These dates include submitting the information online through ShoWorks and postmarking the appropriate DNA sample(s). Late nominations will not be accepted.
