Keep reminding everyone in your club and your friends to reenroll on 4-H Online! We need to get everyone re-enrolled as soon as possible. If they plan on participating in club day, any

camps, conferences, or exhibiting at the county fair they'll need to enroll before they can participate. The last day to change, drop or add a project is May 1. Also note that in order to <u>weigh-in any livestock</u>, the exhibitor must be enrolled before weigh-in. Approval of enrollment can be streamlined if you indicate payment is by coupon and pay enrollment fee into our Extension Office.

If you are a current screened volunteer in your 4-H club and plan to continue to do so, please complete online your Renewal. Almost everything can be completed at 4-H Online, just click on your name and edit, go to volunteer resources section and click on screening or renewal. If you have questions please contact Andrea and she can walk you through it. They are also available on our website or can be found on-line at www.kansas4-h.org and click on the Volunteer link for a form-fillable version.

County Club Day–February 4

County Club Day will be at the Dodge City Senior Center, 2408 Central, Dodge City. We will start at 8 a.m. with events. An email was sent to you after your enrollment through Signup Genius. A schedule is also posted on our website.

Remember you must be enrolled to participate in a club activity.

Saturday, March 4, 8:00 am, Dodge City Nazarene Church 1700 W. Ross Blvd, Dodge City Schedules will be available online the week prior. Participation will be in person presentations. If a County Club Day presentation receives a Top Blue, you will be notified.

COUNTY FAIR & OTHER SHOWS LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN DATES—

If you are planning on showing livestock this year at the County Fair, you MUST weigh and tag your livestock at the respective weigh-in dates. Beef weigh-in has been set for Thursday, February 16 from 4:00-6:00 p.m. at Winter Livestock. In case of bad weather that day, it will be moved to Thursday, Feb. 23 . You will be notified if it changes. Small livestock weigh-in will be Tuesday, April 18, 4:00-6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds.

State Fair and Other Shows (not County Fair livestock)

A service charge of \$25 will be applied per trip to tag animals for other shows not brought to respective weigh-in dates.

What if the 4-H'er is unable to be at the weigh-in? No worries, the ANIMAL can be brought to the weigh-in by anyone. If you have questions, just let us know!

EAR TAG POLICY 4-H Council policy allows a 4-H'er up to six (6) ear tags per species (i.e. up to 6 for beef, 6 for sheep, 6 for goats, 6 for swine). Any tags over the provided six will be at the expense of the 4-H'er and their family and will need to be reimbursed to 4-H Council.

Training costs and schedules will be released in early February with registration opening mid-February. Local Extension Units must approve potential new instructor. The volunteer will then need to register in 4-H Online and complete volunteer screening through the office. In 2022 (last year), we had a county percentage of 47% of completed record books. I asked the question: What is our goal for 2023?

If every FC 4Her completes a record book, there are currently incentives in place to possibly win prizes for you & your club – thanks to the FC 4-H Foundation! Also, you might have the opportunity to compete at regionals, state and attend National 4-H Congress. It's an experience of a lifetime! Youth, adults, extension agents, project leaders, and volunteers are invited to attend!

FORD COUNTY FEE POLICIES—EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2014 REMINDER OF OUR FEE'S POLICY

- For any activity registration: Payment arrangements can be made in writing with the Extension Office to set up a payment schedule. *Full payment is due by the registration deadline.*
- For online registrations: <u>Full payment is due to the Extension Office by the online event deadline</u> <u>unless a written payment agreement is made between the Extension Office</u> and the participant. Failing to meet those requirements will result in cancellation of registration (participant will still be responsible for the \$25 cancellation fee and possible registration cost based upon event guidelines.)
- **Transportation:** A transportation fee of \$10 per person will be added to fees for trips that require travel in a county vehicle outside of Ford County (ex. Advanced Master Gardener training, State FCE Conference, KS Youth Leadership Forum, Discovery Days, Camp at Rock Springs, judging events, etc.)
- **Tagging Livestock:** A service fee of \$25 per trip will be charged for trips made to tag livestock <u>for</u> <u>state shows (county fair animals must attend county wide weigh-in)</u> or to re-tag livestock that have lost their original tags.
- **Transportation for Other Counties:** Ford County will require a \$25 per person to transport participants from other counties to events.

4-H Recognition and Record Books

Now is the perfect time to start thinking about your project goals, if you have not already started. There is a 4-H publication called "Setting 4-H Project Goals", <u>https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/4H1100.pdf</u> which can help you with this process. What is a Project Goal? A goal is deciding what you want to do and learn in a 4-H Project. It help you set what you want to do for the year. Goals should have three parts — Action (How are you going to do something); Result (What are you going to do and you want to be specific); and Timetable (When are you going to do it). When we judge record books we look for specific goals and goals you have control over. Saying you want to receive a purple ribbon is not a specific goal. Saying you want to learn a specific technique, making pies or cakes, or attend meetings or be a junior leader are specific goals. Do you have control over all parts of what happens? Saying you want to receive a purple ribbon placing.

Record Books — Youth may choose to use either record keeping option: a.) the fillable PDF Project report forms or b.) the online ZBooks software.

The **Permanent Record** is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities into the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document. You can also continue doing your permanent record the way you have been and filling it out as a pdf.

KSRE website—<u>https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/awards-and-recognition/ZBooks.html</u> has resources for you to use for both options. If you click on the videos on the page, be sure to click on the video and then click on YouTube on the bottom of the video screen to watch a larger version in YouTube. Otherwise it is a very tiny video!

Be sure you complete every section of the project record. Judges look to see if you did some type of a presentation on your project, try and do something in leadership and citizenship for your project. We realize some projects are easier to provide citizenship for. Example in foods you could provide refreshments for meetings, help with meals, donate food to the food pantry, etc. Show pictures of you doing these things. We want to see pictures of your project and not just a fair entry photo with your ribbon. Show pictures of you working on the project, feeding your animals, cooking/baking, etc. Don't forget your story on your Reflection page. Answer the questions, but also be sure to include what you did throughout the year in your project. Again not just what you took to the Fair and what ribbons you received. What did you learn??? What did you do??? Look back at your goals. Tell how you achieved your goals.

Achievement Pins: Check out the Achievement Pin application to see what you need to work on to receive the next pin in the Achievement pin series! These are available on our Ford County Extension Website under 4-H Awards and Recognition. If you are not sure about one of the requirements, please contact the office. Several of the pins in the series requires you to be enrolled in the leadership project. Make sure you are by May 1 if you need to enroll in this project.

Questions?? Please contact Andrea or Ethel. We would be happy to help you. Remember you don't have to wait to start on any part of these forms. Start writing your story and add to it each month. You can always cut something out. Start marking off the achievement pin application, work on your goals, etc.
