4-H ENROLLMENTS

GROWS HERE

This is your last call to get your 4-H on-line updated for 2023 and volunteers need to update their profiles, too! This will be the last month that we will send out the newsletter if you have not re-enrolled by January 31. You are now able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, except Livestock projects, which need to be enrolled in prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each project.

CLUB LEADERS— It is very important that you set up a Volunteer Profile in 4-H Online and verify that you have completed the volunteer training in 4-H Online! This helps us manage volunteer resources, training, and certification. Please remember that in order for a 4-H Club to be in good standing, you must have TWO leaders who have current 4-H volunteer certification.

LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN DATES

If you are planning on showing livestock this year at the County Fair, you MUST weigh and tag your livestock at the respective weigh-in dates. Beef weigh-in has been set for February 16 at Winter Livestock between 4:00 -6:00 pm. Bad Weather date is February 23.

Ford County Fair 2023 DATES

The Ford County Fair will be held Thursday, July 20 through Monday, July 24 with fashion review judging July 17, set up on July 18, and clean up on Wednesday, July 26. Please put these dates on your calendars.

Fair Checks and Thank You Notes

A reminder we still have a few exhibitors who have not turned in thank you notes for County Fair premiums, livestock sale etc. Please do so as soon as possible. If checks are not picked up and cashed by February 1, premiums will be forfeited and returned to the Fair Association. These checks had four very generous community businesses donated funds which were evenly split to each exhibitor, so your check is more then just the premium money from your exhibits. JUNIOR PRODUCER DAYS REGISTRATION OPEN

The 2023 Kansas Junior Producer Day dates have been set! Kansas Junior Swine Producer Day will be Saturday, March 11 with Kansas Junior Goat Producer Day scheduled for Saturday, March 18. Both events will be hosted in Weber Hall on the K-State campus in Manhattan. These events are one-day educational events for families to learn more about the selection and management of a specific specie. Youth, adults, extension agents, project leaders, and volunteers are invited to attend!

Presentations will be provided by K-State faculty, staff, students, extension agents, and guest speakers. Topics range from selection, to nutrition, to meat science and showmanship. Tentative schedules and registration information are forthcoming. Youth Contests include Showmanship, Judging Classes, Breed ID and Best Bunny Costumes. There is a show fee of \$4.00 per rabbit. Dog Judges Training and Re-Certification

The 2023 Kansas 4-H Dog Judges Training and Recertification will be held in Wichita at the Extension Center on January 27-29. Beginning the training on Friday evening has allowed participants in one weekend to be trained in and certified in the four dog phases of showmanship, obedience, agility and rally obedience of the Dog Care and Training Project.

New judges can be certified and returning judges can get a refresher and be re-certified. This is also a good opportunity for local dog project leaders and older 4-H members to observe the training and better understand how they will be judged at invitational and the Kansas State Fair 4-H Dog Show. Participants must be 16-years-old and up to attend this certification and training. Emails will be sent to judges needing to recertify and encourage them to become familiar with the new Kansas 4-H Dog Rule Book https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/4H1120.pdf

New judges are always needed. If you are a parent or someone who wants to help our 4H youth with the dog project, please consider taking the training. All registering should have knowledge of the 4-H Dog Program.

<u>Registration</u> is open! Registration Deadline is January 15, 2023. The Certification cost is \$95 and Observing cost is \$50. Judges will be able to select which areas they would like to certify in: showmanship, obedience, rally obedience and/or agility. Those who received a score of 80% or higher are recertified for the next 5 years. If they received a lower score, they will need to complete an in-person recertification process when it becomes available.

4-H Horse Panorama

The 2023 4-H Horse Panorama is scheduled for January 28, 2023, at K-State Salina. In-person and virtual contests are available to Kansas 4-H members enrolled in the Horse or Horseless Horse project including Horse Bowl, Hippology, presentations, photography, design and more.

The 2023 4-H Horse Panorama registration will be completed through Qualtrics at the link provided on the 4-H Horse Panorama website (https://www.kansas4-h.org/events-activities/conferences-events/horse/horse-panorama.html). Registration is due January 10, 2023.

Virtual contests for 2023 will be Photography, Logo Design, Ad Layout, Poster, PowerPoint and Model Horse. Exhibits must be submitted via Qualtrics by 11:59pm. January 20, 2023. Participants in virtual contests need not be present at Horse Panorama to participate in the virtual contests. Members participating only in virtual contests will not be charged a registration fee. HOW DO I REGISTER?

EACH 4-H'er participating in an INDIVIDUAL event needs to fill out an event registration online through Sign Up Genius. If a 4-H'er is competing in a CLUB event, the club leader needs to register for a club time through Sign Up Genius. Please list ALL participants names in the comment area.

Registration link will be available on our Extension website after January 3. Registration needs to be completed by January 27.

COUNTY CLUB ::EVENTS::

**Clubs are required to do a group event to count towards their SEAL! **

Check General Guidelines as several categories you must give the judge a copy of your music, reading, etc.

MODEL MEETING

•Model Meeting - club and 1 or 2 adults

This event allows clubs to act out a 'proper business meeting' which 4-H Clubs do each month at their regular 4-H Club Meeting. In this event, clubs must include 5 parliamentary practices found in the 'Club Days Guidelines.' Two additional topics will be drawn at the competition and must be included during the competition. Please contact the office for more information.

•Gavel Games - 4-6 members

This is a great way for youth to practice

parliamentary procedure in a fun atmosphere.

Please see the 'Club Days Guidelines' for complete rules and information.

DRAMATICS:

•One Act Play - group

This is FUN for a club to do! Grab a script and practice, practice, practice! Only one scene set allowed.

•Skit - group

This is also fun for creative minds. Make up your own skit and put costumes and a set to it!

•Novelty - individual or group

Are you in gymnastics? Do you like to do ventriloquists acts, stunts, puppets or other forms of entertainment?

•Vocal Performance - a solo or group (2 or more) perform a musical piece; sheet music not required for the judges.

DANCE:

•Folk Step Dance - group

May include circle, line, Irish, polka dance etc.

•Square Dance - group

Kick-off your shoes for some good ol' fashioned square dancing! 10 min max.

•Other Dance - individual or group

Are you in ballet, tap, cheerleading, clogging, etc? Then this is for you!

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

- •Show & Tell 1st or 2nd yr. junior members only This event is as simple as bringing your favorite toy and telling the judge all about it.
- •**Project Talk** junior members only Gain confidence by talking to a judge about your favorite project in 4-H. Visuals are encouraged.
- •Public Speaking senior members only Take the next step and write your own speech on a topic of your choice. 15 min max.
- •Extemporaneous Speaking senior members only Participant draws two topics at competition and chooses one of them to speak on. 15 min prep time.

Digital Presentation

Put your PowerPoint skills to work! This event can be on a 4-H Project or topic of your choice.

Demonstration

Show the judge how to make a smoothie, sew on a button, or groom your dog in REAL life!

•Illustrated Talk Readings

Show the judge how to do something by using pictures or drawings.

Readings

May be a musical, dramatic, interpretive, humorous or other type of reading. 10 minutes or less Readings need not be memorized.

MUSIC:

Do you have a favorite song from band or vocal in school that you'd love to share for a judge? If so, enter it for Club Days! 4-H'ers must have sheet music for judges. An ensemble has 2-5 4-H'ers participating.

Vocal Solo or Ensemble

•Chorus - 6 or more in group

Group will sing two songs of their choosing.

Instrumental Solo or Ensemble

•Band or Orchestra - 6 or more in group
